EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM

Creating paths for employment in tourism and hospitality



The Tourism & Hospitality Employment Program is 100% funded by the Government of Canada's Sectoral Initiatives Program in partnership with Latincouver, Acsenda and ISS Language Career College of BC to generate a unique opportunity to learn about this fascinating industry. The training's objective is to provide to participants the skills and knowledge needed to get employment in the Tourism & Hospitality sector.



To be eligible to apply you need to be a Canadian Citizen or permanent resident or be a protective person legally entitled to work in Canada. You'll go through a screening process with our team members to confirm eligibility. Women, youth, and visible minorities will have priority to be confirmed in the program.



SCHEDULE

From April 19th we will be hosting this first cohort from 9 to 13hs. Over the following months (dates to be confirmed), we will have another 3 cohorts.



The program will last 24 weeks in a hybrid format, online and in person. The last 4 weeks will be work experience.



• Program Orientation & Essential Skills: Participants will receive one week of program orientation, essential skills training, & basic employability skills including Vancouver Market, digital literacy and professional communication skills.















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• Occupational English Language: Participants will receive one week of occupational language training in preparation for employment in the Canadian Workforce.



- Short Term Occupational Certifications: Participants will receive one week online-facilitated certification in the following short-term courses:
 - First Aid Course
 - Food Safe Certificate
 - Pandemic Awareness (Worksite Safety Compliance Centre)
 - Serving Right Certificate,
 - Health and Inclusion in the Workplace (GBA+)
 - Digital marketing training that will last one week
- Hospitality Training by Acsenda School of Management that will last fifteen weeks from Monday to Friday 9:00 to 15:00hs:
 - Introduction to the Canadian Hospitality Environment
 - Accommodation Services
 - Food and Beverage Services
 - Events and Catering Services
 - Sustainability and Community Engagement in Hospitality.
- · The participants will earn work experience placement during four weeks.
- · During the last week, participants will get preparation to get a job in the sector. This includes establishing a job search plan; certifications portfolio; membership in professional organizations; identifying mentorship opportunities; resume & cover letters; introduction to online job boards; interview prep; work log; &, developing networking skills. Participants will be supported in their search for Tourism & Hospitality jobs through networking with employers across Metro Vancouver.













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NOC CODES: The program is related to the following National Occupation Classification codes:

6513 Food and beverage servers: Food and beverage servers take patrons' food and beverage orders and serve orders to patrons. They are employed in restaurants, hotels, bars, taverns, private clubs, banquet halls and similar establishments

6512 Bartenders: Bartenders mix and serve alcoholic and nonalcoholic beverages. They are employed in restaurants, hotels, bars, taverns, private clubs, banquet halls and other licensed establishments. Supervisors of bartenders are included in this unit group.

6511 Maîtres d'hôtel and hosts/hostesses: Maîtres d'hôtel and hosts/hostesses greet patrons and escort them to tables, and supervise and co-ordinate the activities of food and beverage servers. They are employed in restaurants, hotel dining rooms, private clubs, cocktail lounges and similar establishments.

6525 Hotel front desk clerks: Hotel front desk clerks make room reservations, provide information and services to guests and receive payment for services. They are employed by hotels, motels and resorts.
